NWWC Annual Report 2020/21 Season

The collaboration known as North West Women's Cricket (NWWC) between the Merivale Papanui Cricket Club (MPCC) and Burnside West Christchurch University Cricket Club (BWCUC) continued to draw on the combined resources of the two clubs to support women's cricket from school (Year 5) to adult.

During the off season in the lead up to the summer, the Christchurch Metro Cricket Association (CMCA) approved an application from NWWC for a full entry into the Women's Premier Grade. This was a significant step up from the previous inclusion in only the 16 over Kirsty Bond competition to participation in all three formats of Premier Women's cricket - 16 over, T20 and One Day 50 over cricket. This exciting development ensured a full pathway from juniors to Premier cricket for the NWWC players was secured.

Entry into the Premier grade necessitated the need for the establishment of new coaching strategy to support the players at the highest level. The process of advertising for a coach was completed and the appointment of Hannah Beatson and Nigel Marsh as co-coaches was made. Alongside the coaching decisions Andrew Clayton was appointed as the Premier Grade Manager.

Teams in other grades continued to be coached and managed by parents and volunteers. Mike Dunlop and Bruce Scott provided the majority of coaching support for the Div 1 and Under 16 players with support from Angus McIntosh. Craig Stanley and Helen Hodder managed these two important development teams. During the season Kelvin McKissock came in to support the selection process and did an excellent job of ensuring these teams had the players they needed to compete each week.

Some of our senior players continued to contribute back into the NWWC collaboration by coaching junior teams. Thanks to Molly Dunlop, Hannah Foster, Kate Hastings, Kelly Hodder, Hannah Mackay.

The NWWC Committee again was a diverse group representing the various interests and needs from across all aspects of the collaboration. Thanks to this group for the enthusiasm and commitment that the vital administrative work was attended to throughout the season.

NWWC Premier Women's Team - Captain's Report

The 2020/2021 season has been a hard fought, but rewarding one. We have all faced the huge step up of heading into the Premier competition. What appeared as a challenge, we took as an opportunity to improve our game and prove our worth in this grade. We finished fifth in the One Day and Twenty20 competitions, but managed to achieve third in the Kirsty Bond Series.

We came up against some excellent teams in the One Day competition and although finishing winless, improved immensely from where we started from earlier in the season. Our last game of the season we had a close loss to Lancaster Park, scoring our top score of 168 in 45.3 overs and keeping LPCC out there for 39.3 overs and taking 6 wickets, a massive achievement for us against a quality side. We also had some great bowling and batting performances with 3/22 for Abigail Hotton and 3/46 for Nicola Clayton throughout the competition.

The Twenty20 competition was a very short two game campaign for us. Despite this we had Abigail Hotton take 1/13 as well as two very well deserved run outs from the team. We also had Izzy Sharp top score for us at 37.

The Kirsty Bond Series highlighted the talent we have coming through at NWWC and gave the team a real confidence boost. Our first win in 2020-21 Premier season and our first as the Premier Women's team came at about halfway through the season with NWWC winning by 25 runs against LPCC with an outstanding team performance. Coming away from Kirsty Bond, we ended with eight wins and for a period of time had a five game winning streak in the second half of the season. Again we had some great individual performances over the season with the likes of Izzy Sharp scoring 62* and Libby Stead having bowling figures of 3/11.

Our Player's Player this season went to Maddie Morrow for her great attitude (and not so great song choices). Coach's Award went to Libby Stead for this season for her captaincy and leadership of the team and our MVP went to Kate Hastings for her consistent and gritty batting efforts at the top of the order each week.
